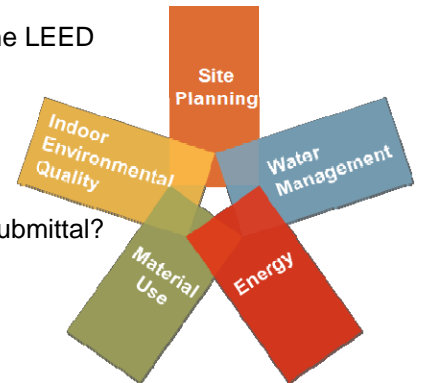
## It's Green, But What Does it Mean?
