Eligibility Requirements

- Must have completed high school
- Must be a U.S. Citizen
- Must have consent of his employer to attend the PM Training Program

How Applications Are Judged - Selections will be based on overall worthiness of the applicant by the EGCA Scholarship Committee. Notification of award will be on **January 23rd, 2015**.

The applicant will be able to demonstrate the following:

- How a being certified PM will change their value and enhance their current employment.
- How this scholarship will allow them to attend a necessary course they would otherwise be unable to afford.
- Communicate their long-term goals and business development strategies.
- Clearly showcase their history and past achievements and successes through a written resume.
- Identify a specific project their employer would have had the opportunity to bid but were unable to successfully bid due to their size, or/and lack of an unqualified PM.

Along with a resume and application the individual will provide a referral letter from their employer stating the reasons the employer feels the applicant is a qualified candidate and their understanding of the commitment required to successfully complete the course. The letter will also state why they feel having a certified PM will help them achieve their company goals.

Selected finalists will be invited to a personal interview with the Scholarship Selection Committee.
