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CALIFORNIA PREVAILING WAGE LAW BASICS: LABOR COMMISSIONER INVESTIGATIONS & PENALTY ASSESSMENTS

What is the Prevailing Wage?

The prevailing wage is a base reimburse rate, time-honored by the State and Federal law to make sure that all construction employees, involved in public works projects are compensated sufficiently for the craft they are functioning in. It is an amalgamation of an hourly pay rate and fringe benefits. Compensation of the prevailing wage guarantees that contractors will employ qualified employees and the City will thus get quality work.

Course Description: Labor Commissioner investigations – and corresponding penalty assessments – are steadily on the rise. This course will review the basics of California prevailing wage law, including common pitfalls to avoid.
